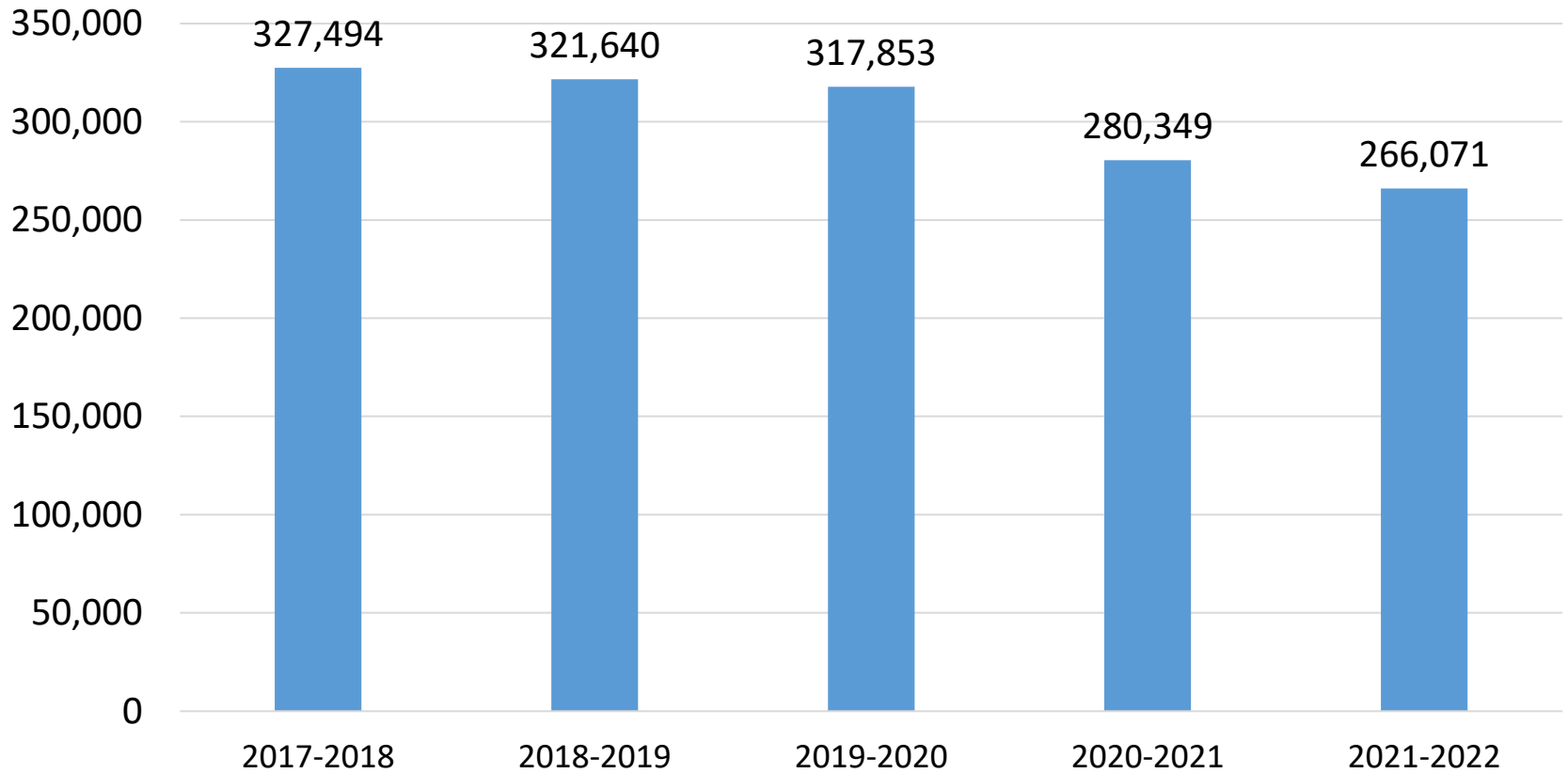

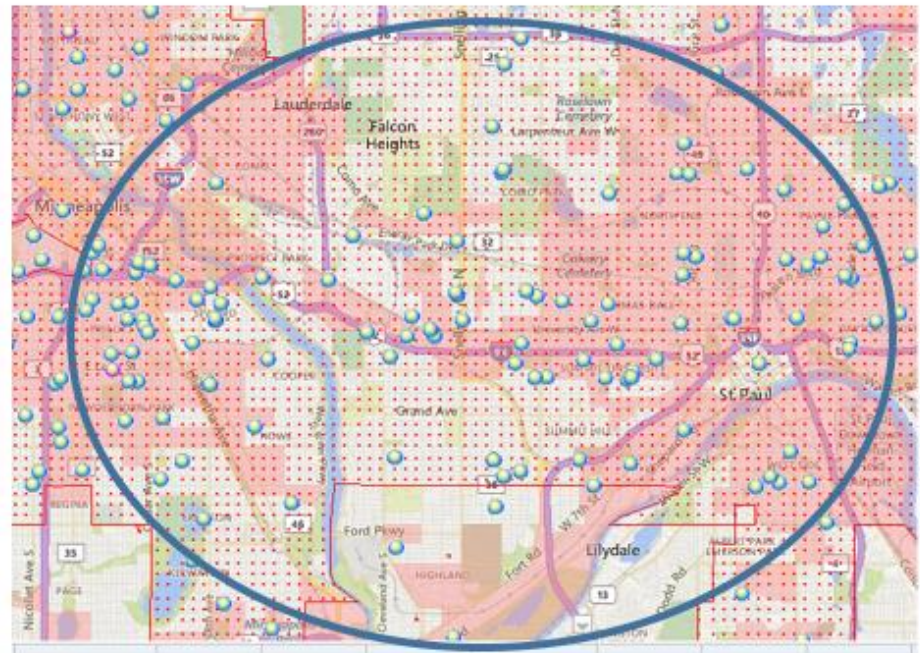
Food for Every Child
